This is an activity very few children at Abbeyfield have accessed before and they increased in confidence on the ice every week.</p> <p>Also through this opportunity we were able to have a portable ice rink on the school grounds which all of the children in KS2 and Y2 were able to access. Again this, for some children, is an activity they have never experienced before and they thoroughly enjoyed.</p>

Children have access to quality resources for lessons.</p> <p>Purchasing this equipment also resulted in more opportunities for children to be physically active during playtimes and lunchtimes. For example the purchase of large football nets which were placed on the</p>

				playground as well as the MUGA and barriers to make a safer area for children to play the football in and basketball hoops.
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
